"Communicating the Mystery"

The Trinity is the great mystery of the church - was discussed as early as 180 AD and probably earlier. Formulated at the Council of Nicea in 325

from the introduction to Writings on the Trinity, Grace, and Faith by Jonathan Edwards, edited by Sang Hyun Lee

The Christian doctrine of God as the Trinity was originally formulated by the ancient church fathers as a confessional expression of faith, not as a speculative idea. The church fathers believed that the God they experienced in JC by the power of the HS is the same God as the God they knew as the Creator and the Lord of creation. This belief had to be articulated in a doctrinal formula so to make clear the distinctiveness of the identity of the Christian God in relation to various other conceptions of the deity. They had to find some way to affirm that God was one and three. The God of the biblical witness, in other words, is at once one and also distinctively three: the Father, the SOn, and the Holy Spirit. All fine and good, but who are we in relation to the Trinity, as created beings?

We are storytellers, pattern-seekers, and meaning-makers, who are made in the image of God - the One in Three.

## STORY TELLERS

God *creates* the Story in Creation *tells* the Story in Scripture *continues* the Story in Christ

Psalm 29 -- Ascribe - recognize the author of the story. Give the author the credit for the story being told

- --We participate in the story God has written, is writing and will write
- --We "ascribe"
  - --Participants in the story God has written and participants in the Trinity

What story will you tell? What story do we want our church to tell?

## PATTERN SEEKERS

Jesus sets the pattern for us in his life, death and resurrection forms the pattern in our daily rising and dying in our baptism continues the pattern in others through us

Romans 8 - formed by a spirit of adoption formed by our shared inheritance with Christ

--Christ's pattern becomes our pattern

--Love -- God and others

--Forgiveness -- 77 times 7

--**Devotion** -- "he went off alone to pray"

--**Trust** - Matthew 6; "your will he done"

What is the pattern of your life? What is the pattern of our church?

Does it mirror the pattern of Christ's life, as best we can discern in this day and age?

## MEANING MAKERS

The Holy Spirit makes meaning in our lives by helping us remember the past recreating God's kingdom in our spiritual lives re-joining (religion) us to the community of faith

- --Meaning derives from the new life we have been given in Christ -
- --cf: Matthew 28 "in the name of the Father, the Son, and the HS

vs: 20 -- Teach them to obey everything I have commanded

- --What has been commanded?
  - --Isn't there only one command -
    - --to love God and love one another?
- --What does love mean?
  - --For a Christian, this is the meaning-making we are creating, seeking and learning.
- --What is love?
  - --The story God is telling
  - --The pattern of the life, death and resurrection of JC
  - --The meaning we gain from the Spirit

What is the meaning you have derived from your relationship with God, Christ, and the HS?

What does this relationship we each share with the Trinity mean for us as a church?

How will we communicate that meaning to others?
